### "GOD Gives, Has Given, and Will Give" by Pastor Andy Lee

Right out of college, my home church offered me a part-time youth director position. For about half a year, the church decided it would pay me \$500/month. In hindsight, maybe I should have hired an agent to negotiate on my behalf, because \$500/month is not a lot of money. Even so, I took the job anyway. I figured I could use any extra income while I attended seminary. I also reminded —or convinced- myself the job did have the added bonus of providing relevant ministry experience.

During dinner later that week, my parents congratulated me. Apparently, I made a lot of people happy: the kids were excited, the parents were proud to have a homegrown member doing ministry, and the pastor was relieved about finally filling the position. Great. I liked hearing that. I felt encouraged and my heart flooded with positive vibes. Unfortunately, my parents had to ruin it all by broaching the topic of tithing.

Tithing? I felt like I had been slapped in the face. Tithing? I was totally uninterested in the idea. Tithing? \$500 was barely enough to pay for the expenses I had. How could anyone expect me to fork over another 50 bucks?! My parents calmly tried to help me consider all the reasons I should tithe. They approached me like an adult. Sadly, I responded like a child.

I left the house angry. I slammed the door. It's a classic move. I bet I looked really cool doing it. Full of frustration but having no place to go, I powerwalked to a nearby park. Sitting on a bench, I tried to sort out my thoughts. It was difficult trying to explain why I felt so defensive. Financially speaking, I could make it work. I knew how to be frugal. \$50 would not make or break me.

The reality is, money is extremely personal. It's intimately tied to so many other concepts in our lives such as freedom, security, pleasure, and status. As a newly employed person, this was the first time I had wrestled with such ideas. Admittedly, my parents did me a favor by helping me to consider a tithe. The number one reason people don't give generously to God is because they are never asked.

So, as your pastor, it is my responsibility to ask you to consider giving generously to God. Every year around this time, our church will participate in a stewardship campaign in which we will explore the connection between God and our giving. We are invited to consider what percent of our income we are called to give in the next season.

After a few weeks of discernment, a stewardship campaign concludes with a Consecration Sunday.

This year Consecration Sunday takes place on November 17<sup>th</sup>. During service on that day, those present can fill an "estimate of giving" card. It is a nonbinding estimate for the year 2020. This process is designed to be low-stakes and void of any pressure. I hope to see you November 17<sup>th</sup> for Consecration Sunday.

Now, back to my story. By the time I returned home, I decided I would tithe. I laughed at myself as I recounted God's goodness in my life. God created me, God provided me with a loving family, and God sent Jesus into the world to redeem me. Yet, when it came to honoring God with a measly 50 dollars a month, I put a fight and stormed out of my house. Truly laughable! Regardless of my giving, my generosity pales in comparison to God what gives, has given, or will give to me. So, honoring God with a tithe or more, at least in my situation, has and continues to make sense.

For 2020, my family and I estimate our giving will be \$13,200 a year or \$1,100 a month. I share this with you not for applause or praise. Rather, I share with this you for two reasons. First, I want to demonstrate that I walk alongside you. I am not someone that expects others to do things I am unwilling to do. Second, I wholeheartedly believe God is doing something worthwhile within our midst. I believe it, and I imagine, on some level, you do too. As you consider what percentage God is calling you to give this season, I hope and pray it reflects a posture of hope, faith, and excitement.

May the Lord's light continue to shine upon you! Pastor Andy Lee

#### FROSTED CRANBERRY COOKIES

-Shirley Kidd, New London, Minnesota

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

1/2 cup butter, softened

1 cup sugar 3/4 cup packed brown sugar 1/4 cup whole milk

1 large egg 2 tablespoons orange juice

3 cups all-purpose flour 1 teaspoon baking powder

1/4 teaspoon baking soda 1/2 teaspoon salt

2-1/2 cups chopped fresh or frozen cranberries

**FROSTING:** 1/3 cup butter 2 cups confectioners' sugar 2 to 4 tablespoons hot water

1-1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract

#### **Directions**

In a bowl, cream butter and sugars. Add milk, egg and orange juice; mix well. Combine the flour, baking powder, salt and baking soda; add to the creamed mixture and mix well. Stir in cranberries and nuts.

Drop by tablespoonfuls 2 in. apart onto greased baking sheets. Bake at 350° until golden brown, 12-15 minutes. Cool on wire racks.


For frosting, heat the butter in a saucepan over low heat until golden brown, about 5 minutes. Cool for 2 minutes; transfer to a small bowl. Add sugar and vanilla. Beat in water, 1 tablespoon at a time, until frosting reaches desired consistency. Frost the cookies.


All proceeds benefit the Walugembe Family in Uganda and our other Missions giving.
