### No Matter What Lies Ahead

Friends of Commerce UMC,

By now, you may have heard or read about a separation proposal for the United Methodist Church. Taken from UM News (<u>https://www.umnews.org/en/news/diverse-leaders-group-offers-separation-plan</u>), here is a brief summary:

"A diverse, 16-member group of United Methodist bishops and other leaders has offered a proposal that would preserve The United Methodist Church while allowing traditionalist-minded congregations to form a new denomination. The separating group would get \$25 million in United Methodist funds and would keep its local church properties.

The proposal requires approval by the 2020 General Conference. Drafting of legislation is still underway for the legislative assembly, which is the only body that speaks for the 13 million global denomination."

Key elements of the plan:

- The General Council on Finance and Administration of The United Methodist Church would provide \$25 million, over four years, "to the traditionalist Methodist denomination established pursuant to this protocol." The new denomination would give up further claims to United Methodist assets, including those of general boards and agencies.
- An annual conference, whether in a central conference or U.S. jurisdictional conference, also could vote to affiliate with a new Methodist denomination. A vote of 20 percent or more at an annual conference session would be needed to have the disaffiliation vote, and a disaffiliation vote would have to pass by 57 percent. The disaffiliation vote deadline is July 1, 2021.
- The leadership body of a local church considering disaffiliation could determine a threshold of a simple majority or two-thirds for the vote on whether to separate. Decisions about disaffiliation must be made by December 31, 2024.

Please be aware this is a proposal. Nothing has taken effect. Again, the proposal requires approval by the 2020 General Conference which takes place May 5-15, 2020 in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Collectively, we will have a better sense of what our options are in the aftermath of General Conference. Therefore, I encourage you to please remain calm, be in prayer, and feel free to stop by my office to flesh out any concerns you may have.

I want you to know whether you consider yourself to be a Traditionalist, Centrist, or Progressive, I am your pastor and I care for you deeply. Let us continue to see each other as people rather than as ideological allies or opponents. We are the body of God, and no matter what lies ahead, I trust we will all be stronger for it.

We are happy to announce that for 2019 the Commerce UMC will qualify as an "EngageMI Church"; formerly known as "Spotlight Church".

EngageMI is a new way to approach neighbors next door and around the world with the eyes of your heart. It's a new giving and engagement program introduced at the MI Anl. Conference in 2018. This new initiative begins when previous programs — Six Lanes of Advance and Spotlight Church – end on December 31, 2018. The multi-layered approach of EngageMI challenges congregations to LEARN, GIVE, and ACT. Beginning January 1, 2019 congregations

were asked to engage in at least one LEARN and one ACT experience during the year. GIVE involves the funding of programs — local, regional and global — through Ministry Shares and Advance Specials recognized by the General Board of Global Ministries or The Michigan Conference
