The Lenten Season has begun!

On Ash Wednesday, the roads were a mess. Yes, winter is still here. As such, the attendance for Commerce UMC's Ash Wednesday service in the historic chapel was a little lighter than in years past. Whether you were able to make it or not, the Lenten season has begun.

The UMC book of worship reminds us,

The early Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became the custom of the Church that before the Easter celebration there should be a forty-day season of spiritual preparation.

During this season converts to the faith were prepared for Holy Baptism. It was also a time when persons who had committed serious sins and had separated themselves from the community of faith were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness, and restored to participation in the life of the Church.

In this way the whole congregation was reminded of the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ and the need we all have to renew our faith.

We are invited, therefore, to observe a holy lent by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word.

The key word in the season of lent is "invited." We are invited to observe a holy lent by practicing acts of piety. No one's being coerced or manipulated into self-examination and repentance. Again, it is by your own free choosing.

While you may decide you don't want to do anything different in the weeks leading up to Easter, I want to remind you all the important things in life take some work and regular maintenance. The dentist beckons us to get our butts into the office twice a year. The little sticker on the windshield reminds us to change the oil. The nagging wife subtly mentions she cannot remember the last time she got flowers "just because." You get the idea.

Our spiritual health, our relationship with God is of great importance. I encourage you to do what you can to make the most of the Lenten season. There are many insights to be gained, habits to be broken, and opportunities to be explored.

May you experience God afresh in these next few weeks.

Blueberry~Apple~Pineapple (BAP) Dump Cake

This B.A.P. dump cake. is great to take to a potluck and it is the first dessert to go! Sometimes I sprinkle a little extra sugar over the nuts. —Mitzi Erthal, Godfrey, Illinois

Time: less than 1 hour start to finish Serves:15

Ingredients

1 can (21 oz) apple pie filling 3/4 cup unsweetened crushed pineapple, drained

1 package (12 oz) frozen unsweetened blueberries

½ cup white sugar

1 box white cake mis (regular size)

2/3 cup melted butter1 cup chopped Walnuts

½ cup sliced almonds



Directions

Preheat oven to 350 deg. Grease 13x9 baking dish

Mix together; pie filling and pineapple and dump into greased 13x9 baking dish

Toss to coat blueberries with white sugar, then spoon them over the pie filling mix in the baking dish. Sprinkle cake mix over fillings in the baking dish.

Drizzle melted butter evenly over cake mix.

Top with walnuts and almonds.

Bake 45 to 55 minutes until golden brown and bubbly. Serve Warm – refrigerate leftovers.
