A Message from Pastor Andy "Do All Things with Love"

1 Corinthians 13:1-3 states, "If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. 3 If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing."

Sunday, June 21st, our church reopened its doors for in-person worship. If you haven't heard by now, it was a great success. The trustees ensured the safest possible arrangement by setting chairs six feet away, alternating the use of pews, and leaving tables in the narthex to encourage one way traffic in and out of the sanctuary. The ushers masterfully directed traffic. For music, while the congregation couldn't sing, one singer placed in the cry room -don't worry it wasn't against her will- sang on behalf of all who gathered. After worship concluded, people socialized outside in the parking lot. I could not have asked for a smoother worship experience.

I have to admit I was a bit worried leading up to the grand reopening. I don't know about anyone else, but I have seen several video clips of angry customers who refused to wear masks. More often than not, these incidents turned violent. As I stood outside, my heart sank when I saw someone approaching without a mask. I wondered if he/she would comply with my request to put a mask on. My worries were unfounded, because as each person got closer to the entrance, he/she pulled a mask from a back pocket or a purse and put it on.

After weeks of in-person worship, I can foresee the temptation to ease our precautions. They are, after all, what we consider burdens and inconveniences. Believe me, I get it: masks are uncomfortable, sitting silently during a praise song is counter-intuitive, and skipping out on coffee hour seems almost criminal.

However, I want to remind you that these precautions are not meant to be burdensome. Every Sunday as you participate in these extra little precautions, view them as little sign-acts of love, because that's exactly what they are. You put on a mask out of love. Yes, you do it out of love for your neighbor and fellow church attendee. By sitting in silence instead of singing, you prevent liquid droplets from being aerosolized. Or, by socializing outside after service instead of in the fellowship hall over a cup of coffee and donuts, you greatly reduce the risk of any COVID transmission.

So, I thank you for your past deeds of love and I encourage you to continue in them. Let us love one another weekly by abiding by all the necessary precautions so that we can have more opportunities to love another through conventional means in the future.
