A Message from Pastor Andy "ENGAGE YOUR RESOURCE"

February was a tough month. Let me tell you about it. For several days, I had to strap on my winter boots and walk to work. Trekking through the snow from the backdoor of the parsonage to the main entrance of the church is exhausting. My thighs were on fire! Besides the foot of snow we received, the weather was cold even by Michigan standards. I'm still shivering. I don't ever want to see single digit temperatures again. Who's with me?

While I love complaining, I recognize things could have been much worse. In particular, I think of the nightmare our friends in Texas had to endure. Due to the extreme weather, millions were left without power. Tragically, in some cases, lives were lost as a result. For those that were fortunate enough to have power, a portion of these folks were greeted with an astronomically high electricity bill. In response, they have taken to Twitter, Facebook, and other social media platforms in order to vent their frustration and plea for financial relief. It's not uncommon to see a bill for \$5000.

Apparently, these residents had variable-rate power plans. Basically, these plans charge different prices for electricity depending on how much demand there is. The more demand, the higher the price. NPR explains the lure of such a plan, "Variable-rate plans are enticing to many people because the price of electricity is often low during normal weather conditions and because it theoretically allows people to use more electricity when the price is lower — for example, by running appliances overnight." Obviously, when a historic winter storm blows through and shuts down most of the Texas' grid, the price of electricity naturally skyrockets.

I don't know what's going to happen to all those individuals who are stuck with a monstrous bills. It seems likely the state government will step in and the residents ultimately will not have to pay. Whatever the outcome, I imagine if they were faced with the decision to do it all over again, they would still opt to use the power that was available to them.

I share all that to say this. We have a tremendous resource at our disposal and so often we opt not to engage with it. I'm talking about our relationship with the resurrected Christ. We can give him our worries and fears. We can lean on him for strength during our toughest days. Or, we can simply draw near to him in order to smooth out the rough edges of our character. His power is available every moment of every day and best of all, there's no monthly bill!

However, for whatever reason, we choose not to stay plugged into all that Jesus has to offer. It's much more likely we choose to go down a road of great difficulty leaning on our own strength. During this season of lent, let us remember what we're preparing for. Easter

is only a few weeks away. Now is the time to repent from sin or foolish living and instead live into a reality that appropriately reflects what God has, can, and will do for us.

In much the same way you flip the switch and expect the lamp to illuminate your room, may you connect and rely upon the power of Christ in your daily living this season and always.
