A Message from Pastor Andy "Will You Climb The Ladder With Me"

In the pastor's office, like many areas of the church, the lights automatically turn on when a person enters the room. I enjoy the convenience. As many have discovered by now, I am too busy and too important to bother with flicking a switch. A few weeks ago, I walked into the office and the lights, as they have all along, turned on. But, this time there was something wrong. A third of the room was still in darkness. The light had gone out on a pair of bulbs. I paused for a moment but ultimately continued with my morning routine: reading emails, revising to-do lists, and brainstorming sermon illustrations. Admittedly, the darkness from the nonfunctioning lights bothered me, but I continued working.

The next day was the same. I walked in and the broken lights... were still broken. Again, I sat at my desk and got to work. On some level, I think I was hoping the lights, without intervention, would come back to life. I clung to this hope for several days. Then the days turned to weeks. A whole month passed before I finally decided enough was enough. I emailed the trustee chairperson and within a couple of hours a trustee swung by the office.

At first, it appeared we had a very easy fix on our hands. The trustee grabbed a ladder from the equipment closet. When he returned, he tried to open the ladder, but it was too big. After swapping out the tall ladder for a more modest one, he went about opening the unit in order to swap out the old fluorescent lights for new ones.

Unfortunately, swapping out new lights for old ones did not have the desired effect. Something else was wrong. He picked up the phone and called another trustee with more experience. Apparently, the existing bulbs were fine but another component within the fixture would have to be replaced. The part was in the storage closet. Just a few minutes later, with bated breath, we flipped the switch and I finally had a fully lit room. Praise God.

Looking back, it was rather foolish to sit around and spend several weeks sitting in darkness. The problem wasn't going to go away on its own. Faulty components don't just go replacing themselves. Work doesn't magically get done. This is obvious.

September was a busy month. Honestly, September is *always* a busy month as the church transitions from a season of travel and sabbath to resuming all kinds of ministries. Due to the pandemic, the transition was much, much more difficult this year. Attendance and participation are down from pre-pandemic levels which means there are fewer people that can or will engage in vital leadership roles. As we head deeper into the fall, those gaps still exist.

How will we respond?

Will we sit in darkness hoping our problems will fix themselves? Or, will we choose the alternative? Will you roll up your sleeves, bring out the ladder, and address the problem at hand? We have the opportunity to serve in new ways. We have the opportunity to watch God multiply our efforts in this ongoing, challenging pandemic. I thank you for your faithfulness and invite you into more faithfulness in partnership with God.

Are you over 70 1/2 years of age? Did you know that making contributions to the church using direct distributions from your traditional IRA can save you tax dollars? The distribution of funds from your traditional IRA directly to a qualified charity, such as CUMC, is referred to as a qualified charitable distribution (QCD). There are several benefits to this type of distribution:

- 1. You pay no income taxes on the gift. The transfer generates neither taxable income nor a tax deduction, so you benefit even if you do not itemize your deductions.
- 2. Since the gift doesn't count as income, it can reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
- 3. Beginning in the year you turn 72, you can use your gift to satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution (RMD).

Items that need to be considered:

- You must be 70 ½ or older.
- This applies to traditional (pre-tax) IRA's.
- The maximum QCD cannot exceed \$100,000 per tax year from an individual IRA.
- The QCD must be made directly to the charity (the fiduciary must issue check in charity's name).
- The transfer must be completed (check cashed) by December 31st to count against the current year's RMD (Required Minimum Distributions) requirement.

If this is something that is of interest to you, contact your IRA provider as soon as possible. Don't wait until the end of the year!
