### A Message from Pastor Andy

#### To Be Continued

Through my cellphone plan, my family receives a free subscription to Disney+. If you're not familiar with Disney+, it is a streaming service that offers all kinds of Disney properties for your viewing pleasure. What I enjoy the most is re-watching TV shows from my childhood with my daughter. Together, she and I will sit through an episode of Chip and Dale: Rescue Rangers about once a week.

The Rescue Rangers- a team comprised of 2 chipmunks, 2 mice, and a fly- take about 22 minutes to solve crimes of varying degrees. Occasionally, there are episodes in which the crime is not able to be solved within the 22-minute run time. Typically, what happens is, the heroes find themselves in a difficult position and the show ends on a cliff hanger with the words, "To be continued..."

Because my daughter and I are watching through a streaming service, we could instantly click on the next episode. However, 30 years ago, when I was her age, I'd have to a whole day to the conclusion. I'd catch myself wondering how the heroes could possibly make it out of their dire situation. I hated the episodes that ended with the words, "To be continued..." I didn't have the words then, but as a child, I wanted a quick and tidy resolution. No cliff hangers!

You might find yourself in a similar "To be Continued..." scenario. Broadly speaking, that's what we have all gone through with the pandemic. We wondered how we were going to get ourselves out of this corner we were backed into when the virus first hit the news. As a Global denomination, we (members of The United Methodist Church) struggled and continue to struggle over how to best navigate the inclusion of LGBTQ persons. Then, on a personal level, there's a good chance you're going through something right now: a recent health diagnosis, marital problems, financial strain, or something so unique to you I could never guess.

With the resurrected Christ, we know that while we face the unexpected and the unimaginable, our story continues, we have another episode that follows where we will see God's faithfulness unfold. Jesus, an innocent man, was forced through a sham trial, beaten, and brutally executed. But, three days later, God did definitively reveal that God has the final word. So, I want to take this moment to encourage you and to remind you God has the same intention for his people.

As we move toward another Easter celebration, I pray you continue to claim the power of resurrection. I pray you will see all the ways the empty tomb is not just Jesus' story but your story too so that God might sustain you until he comes in final victory.

I look forward to being with you April 17th.

- 3. Humble and Human Exhibit; and Special impressionist Exhibit.





## Canned Veggie Vinaigrette Salad (R.Crepeau)



## Ingredients

- 3 Cans Green Beans
- 2 Cans Sweet Corn
- 2 Cans Small Red Beans
- 1 Can Black Beans
- ½ cup Fine Chopped Green Peppers
- ½ cup Fine Chopped Celery
- 1 cup Fine Chopped Onions
- 1 cup Kraft Sweet Balsamic Vinaigrette Dressing
- a twist or 3 of Ground Black Pepper (optional)
- 2 packet Sugar Substitute (Optional)

### **Directions**

Open, and drain all cans of beans and corn and Rinse with cold water (to rinse excess salt)

Add ALL; beans, corn and chopped veggie (& optional- ground black pepper) together in storage bowl.

Cover with Dressing and seal tight to refrigerate at least 4 hours (overnight is best)
Gently mixing once or twice not to crush & break apart the beans, but to recoat all with the dressing as it tends to pool in the bottom.

Just before serving, mix in the sugar substitute (optional) and any extra dressing if you want. YUM YUM and Healthy too.

- Mission Intern Program ... Serve with children and families experiencing poverty in either a kid's day camp setting leading daily programming and teaching Bible stories OR working in a UMC-related non-profit providing essential services.

Ministry Exploration ... Are you a young adult discerning a call to ordained ministry?
Consider an eight-week internship in a local congregation (maybe even your own
congregation) where you will serve alongside an ordained clergy person, assist in
worship, learn about leadership of the local church.
