



Welcome and Hospitality

Looking out from the pulpit, I see a lot of faces. Most times, those face are in the same exact spot as they were the week before. While we don't have assigned seats, we sit in the same pews as creature of habit. As I write this article for the newsletter, I am placing people in my mind's eye: To my right and in the front, I see... the Wenz family and the Leons. To my left, in the middle back, I spot the Sundbergs.I could go on, but you get the idea.

Because folks generally sit in the same spot, when new people come to worship, I can identify them easily. Even though our sanctuary is quite large and can hold over 300 people, I am still able to identify a new face out of the crowd. After worship concludes, I do my best to catch our visitors. I'm nosey so I'll ask a few questions about where they live and what brought them to church. If the conversation seems to be going well, and they're not in a hurry to leave, I'll ask even more questions and invite them to coffee hour.

Unfortunately, I don't always catch every visitor. Pastor responsibilities are inescapable. Right after worship concludes, I might get pulled aside for prayer requests, questions about the bible, or concerns about the future of the denomination. Meanwhile, the new family with half a dozen kids slips out to the parking lot without me noticing.

It has come to my attention we need to work on a strategy that goes beyond my one-person welcoming plan. I'm excited to see what the leadership team and I can create, but there are a couple of things everyone can do right now.

First, let's get in the habit of wearing our nametags. When we see someone we don't recognize, take the time to say hello and introduce yourself. Who knows where this could lead? It's possible your interaction serves as an anchor for the newcomer. They will go home knowing at least one person. Maybe that makes a difference for when they decide whether to attend a week later.

Second, pray for our visitors. When you pray for visitors, put yourself in their shoes. What's it like to enter a place where you don't know anyone? How can we help others feel welcome? If you invite someone to coffee hour, it's probably not enough just to point at the donuts and say, "help yourself!" In order to create an even more welcoming experience, perhaps it makes sense to invite them to join you at the table and meet some friends.

I mention all this because our church continues to attract new people. God is sending them here so that they can be loved, discipled, and sent into to the world for God's redemptive purposes. We're glad to be a part of such a process, but it begins with a few small steps like saying hi, introducing oneself, and being a wonderful host. Let's continue to be the most welcoming and hospitable version of Commerce UMC.
