#### Welcome and Hospitality

I watched My Little Pony the Movie. Technically, my daughters watched the movie as I sat nearby doing my best to drown out the noise as I tended to church work on my laptop. You see, on August 29th, a storm swept through the area. The lights in the parsonage flickered two or three times and then they shut off for good. My wife and I went to sleep at 9PM that night. The next day we still had no power.

The same was true for our neighbors, the church, and the daycare we send our kids. This meant I had to drive over to my parents' home in Farmington Hills with the kids in tow. As young children do, they screamed and cried out of boredom. In shameful surrender, I inserted the movie into the Blu-ray player. It was a rough day.

Any time the power goes out, we are reminded just how much we depend on it for everyday living. Without electricity, there's no light meaning there's no visibility. Without electricity, the food in our refrigerator is at risk of spoiling. Without electricity, few can effectively work: my computer won't run, and the Wi-Fi can't do whatever the Wi-Fi does so I can use the internet. The dominoes continue to fall. If the daycare has no electricity, then they cannot watch my children which means I must watch my children as my wife gleefully escapes to work at the hospital. In short, I need electricity in my life. I can do so little without it.

September marks the end of summer and a seismic shift goes into motion: widespread traveling comes to a screeching halt, kids are sent back to school, and extracurriculars resume. The life of the church also follows this same pattern. One can expect an increase in attendance and participation. With that, staff and ministry leaders hope to ride the wave. We set goals, dream big, and put programs into motion.

As a church, we want to increase the size and scope of our impact to make disciples and transform the world. However, considering the recent storm, I am reminded of an ever present power that is often taken for granted and I am not referring to electricity. God holds the universe in the palm of God's hand. The sun comes up each morning because God sustains the cosmos. God is the very breath every creature breathes.

So, as we kick off a new season of ministries, let us recall all the ways we depend on God's power. When we decide to invite a friend to join us in worship, call to mind how the spirit has been working in and through this person's life long before we arrived. When we host community events, let us give thanks for the generosity that God instilled in the saints who took on a larger building project in 2008. And, when we work alongside our ministry partners to dismantle evil and oppressive systems let us lean upon the one who gives us the authority to cast out demons in his name. Pastor Andy
