It Doesn't Hurt to Ask

On October 27th, we experienced unseasonably warm weather. The sun was out and the temperature was in the 70's. As we move deeper into the fall and eventually into winter, these instances are becoming increasingly more rare. So, I packed a few snacks and right when my oldest got off the bus, I took her and her younger sister straight to Scarlett's playground. I wanted them to enjoy the rest of the day outdoors.

While they played, I couldn't help but notice Halloween-decorated tables were set up to the north all along a trail. It turned out the library and local businesses were hosting "Trail or Treat" an event in which candy would be passed out to children. I called my wife on the phone and she brought over the kids' costumes and our two little ones had a blast.

The "Trail or Treat" event was one of several opportunities for my kids to accumulate candy. Obviously, the church hosted its super awesome Trunk or Treat. The schools had their own events. Lastly, you can't forget the good old fashion trick or treating that occurs in each of our neighborhoods. I love how our kids have a chance to dress up on multiple occasions and get use out of their overpriced costumes. However, what I do not especially like is having two giant mounds of candy at our house. One belonging to a 5 year old and the other, a 3 year old.

So, I asked them to take some candy out and place it in a bucket. A bucket for

other kids to enjoy. Let's give away some of our candy. I didn't expect them to be enthused about giving away their candy. It is literally their treasure. Their most prized possession. Yet, they listened. They obeyed their nagging father. I fully expected to see the give-away bucket filled with all the candy I know they personally do not like: warheads, almond joys, mounds, whoppers.

Instead, I was surprised to see some really desirable candy: snickers, reese's, kitkat's, Swedish fish, m&m's. My daughters were not selective in what they were giving away. It reached the point where I had to ask them, "are you sure about this? You're okay with giving that one away?" And, they were. They were fine with it.

This experience confirmed what I already know. I've heard the phrase, "It doesn't hurt to ask" on numerous occasions. Whenever we make an ask, we risk little, but in the process we might discover an unexpectedly good outcome.

As a pastor, it is my job to help people grow into mature Christians. There are many components to this. The big one we are addressing this season is our relationship with money. Each of us is called to reflect the generous nature of God. Each of us is called to cheerfully release our treasures back to God. Each of us is called to accomplish God's purposes in the world and we use our money as a tool for that end.

With that said, might I be so bold to make a request? May I ask something of you? For the 2024 fiscal year, would you take one more step in your generosity journey? God is truly at work at Commerce UMC. In-person Sunday worship is robust and healthy. New people are joining our community of faith as we are experience record numbers in the nursery, children's ministry, and youth group. Still, the giving and generosity of our body has not yet matched the growth we are seeing.

So, please consider taking one more step in generosity and faithful obedience. If you have never supported the church, consider giving for the first time. If you

have given on occasion, consider going over your finances and committing to even just 1 percent of your income and give regularly. If you are already giving a portion of your income, consider a 1 percent increase until you reach a tithe. Lastly, if you are already tithing or going beyond the tithe, I thank God for your generosity. Still, since it doesn't hurt to ask, would you consider yet another increase?!

May God continue to sanctify this body and may God continue to bless you so that you might be a blessing to others.
