I enjoy hearing stories about the former pastors of Commerce UMC. In large part, it's because I am an opportunistic thief. Yes, I am happy to steal... steal ideas, that is. If there is a good idea out there, I will snatch it right off the table and shove it in my pockets. I am always looking for good ideas to steal. So, when church members share with me something that Pastor Park or Pastor Wyllys had done in that past that proved effective, I think long and hard about its current application.

For example, I understand that as an incentive to grow the Vacation Bible School attendance numbers, Pastor Wyllys said he would sit on the roof of the church and eat a snickers if the church hit their goal. The church did, and of course, Pastor Wyllys went up on the roof and ate a snickers. This seems to have left a lasting impression on many of you as I hear the story repeatedly almost annually.

As for Pastor Park, he had some attendance related incentive as well. I understand there was something about a ladder. The details are a bit fuzzy, but if my memory serves me correctly, he preached from a ladder during service and claimed wouldn't get down until weekly attendance hit 200. If those details are wrong, feel free to tell me the story again. I am all ears especially because I know his incentive worked. The church averaged 200 people in attendance and he was able to move on from the whole ladder ordeal.


Based on my predecessors' success with driving attendance up with height-related incentives, I am tempted to offer something similar. What if I told you I would eat a snickers bar on a ladder placed atop of the church roof on the condition that we averaged 200 people for in-person worship in 2025? Would that work? Would we see 20 more regular in-person individuals at worship every week? If so, I am all in!

In reality, I do not necessarily care about the attendance numbers increasing for inperson worship. What I care about is the meaning behind the numbers. If we had over 200 people for in-person worship, what this likely means is, our folks are attending more regularly. It also likely means that those who have fallen through the cracks have been remembered and personally re-invited to church. Look, when I re-invite people either by phone call or email, it is not very effective. I am ignored, but when *you* do it, when a friend or fellow member reaches out, things change!

All this to say, I want to put it out there that I would absolutely love to average 200 people for in-person in 2025. Yes, I would love it if those who attend once a month, decided to attend twice a month. Or, if those that attend twice a month chose to attend four times a month. It also means I would love your partnership in reaching out to your friends that have not been present in some time so that you can give them a gentle nudge and express this truth: "We miss you. We need you. We are not the same without you."

And if these changes do happen, I'll be happy to climb a ladder, eat a snicker, and/or sit on the roof... with a fox in a box, with a goat in a boat, or whatever you want, because it will mean that we are taking the right steps toward building stronger disciples, stronger community, stronger faith together. I look forward to all our gracious God has in store for us.


Kids of the Kingdom Comedic Christmas


